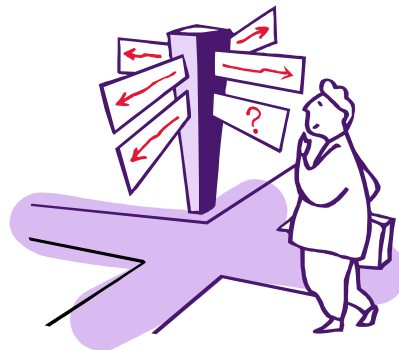

This may include covering basic living expenses, prescription drugs, community start-up and employment start-up funding. To be eligible one must be a resident of Ontario over the age of 16, be in financial need and have a disability that is expected to last one year or more. For help with application see community services and supports section for agencies that may be able to assist with this process.

Government program that provides income and employment assistance for persons in temporary financial need by providing financial assistance and other services to those who are eligible. Some services provided include workshops for job preparation and job searching. To be eligible one must be a resident of Ontario and be in immediate financial need. To participate in Ontario Works a person is required to participate in at least one employment assistance activity. This program strives to help people to get people back to work as quickly as possible. In order to accomplish this, a person can begin working and still receive some benefits from Ontario Works of which 50% income from employment is deducted from those benefits. Provides a monthly disability benefit for individuals who have made enough contributions to the CPP and whose disability prevents them from working at any job on a regular basis and who are under the age of 65. To be eligible the individual must have a disability that is long-lasting or terminal, contributed to CPP for at least 4 of the last 6 years or contributed to CPP for at least 25 years and made contributions for 3 of the last 6 years. The application process can take as long as 3 months. Application forms available online or by calling the toll-free number above. Applications must be in writing. Portion of application must be completed by a doctor. Benefits are also available to children of individuals who receive CPP benefits.

It is important to remember that that the CPP benefit is taxable. This benefit does not cover drug costs or equipment. Can be received in combination with ODSP.

The disability amount is a non-refundable tax credit used to reduce income tax payable on tax returns. To be eligible for this tax credit an individual must have a qualified practitioner certify that they have a prolonged impairment. The application must be approved by the Canada Revenue Agency. The application form can be found online at www.cra.gc.ca/forms or by calling 1-800-959-2221. The form can be sent at any time during the year and if eligible Canada Revenue Agency will validate a certificate showing the qualification for the disability amount that can be used when filing income taxes.

The Independent Living centre is part of network of agencies across Canada dedicated to enhancing community participation and independence for persons with disabilities. It provides free services that include peer-support, information services and linking to services in the community, skill-building opportunities (dealing with barriers in the community, including help with ODSP and Ontario works), Access-to-Technology program (use of a computer lab on-site with adaptive technology), Direct-funding program for Self-Managed Attendant Services (the person with a disability becomes an employer of their own personal attendants), and a drop-in centre. Services are open to individuals with a disability of any nature. The person with a disability must have a desire to be actively engaged in the services. Education awareness training is also provided to the greater community. No fees for service.

The ADP program is funded by the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long Term Care, and provides funding for over 8000 different types of equipment or supplies to people with long term disabilities (including wheelchair, walkers, hearing aids, orthotics etc.). Up to 75% of the cost of equipment may be covered. To be eligible a person must be a resident of Ontario with a valid health card and the person must have a physical disability of 6 months or longer. Specific eligibility criteria apply to each category of equipment. To access this funding a professional who is deemed an ADP Authorizer must assess and prescribe appropriate equipment or supplies, AND application must be made to ADP before the equipment is purchased. ALSO the equipment must be purchased from a registered ADP vendor. There are a number of different vendors in different regions that supply equipment from various categories. For more information on this service, local ADP authorizers, and for a list of vendors, call the toll free number or visit the website. The remaining balance of cost is expected to be paid by the individual; however there are additional sources that may cover the remaining costs such as: Ontario March of Dimes, Easter Seals Society, Lions Clubs, Kingston Oddfellows, Veterans Affairs, Insurance Companies and other charitable organizations.
