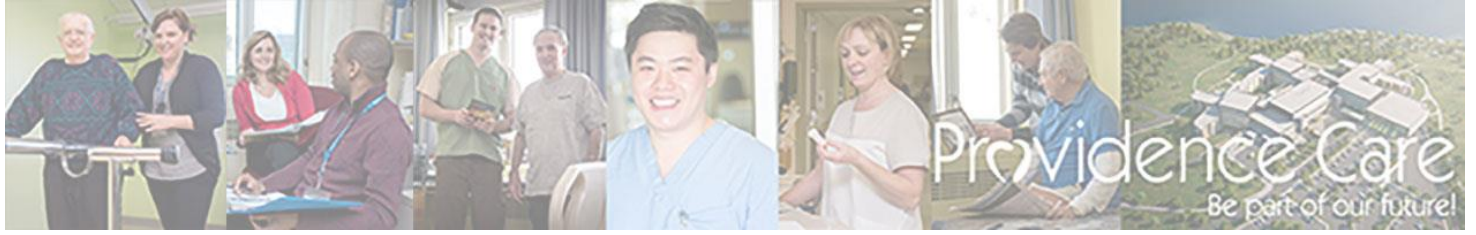
Position Summary:
